24. PROMOTION:

Students with insufficient attendance i.e. 75% attendance or prolonged absence will not be allowed to write Summative Assessment II - pen/paper test.

Promotion to higher class is given to the students who obtain marks/grade as follow:

Class I to IV: Continuous and comprehensive Evaluation as per CBSE norms.

25. PROFICIENCY AWARDS:

Scholar certificates are awarded every year to meritorious students who secure the highest percentage in each class in the final exam. Merit and participation certificates are issued to students throughout a year for various activities and sports, competition and assembly activities at different levels.

26. GRADUATION CEREMONY:

At the end of each academic year eligible students are graduated to the next standard in a colourful ceremony with due procedures including promotion certificates.

27. TALENT SEARCH PROGRAMMES: TALENZIA

The school provides facilities for a number of talent search programmes besides the academic curriculum. These activities are meant to develop communication abilities and perceptual skills apart from proper utilization of leisure. It also gives to the students an experience of fellowship and mutual aid which are essential ingredients of a well-balanced personality. Student participation in most of these activities is compulsory.

28. SPECIAL DAYS:

Dedicated to special occasions special assemblies are organized throughout at the year to celebrate or observe special days, like Father's day in June, career day in July, Independence day in August, Teachers day in September, Students Day in October, Children's Day in November, Republic day in January, Grand parentsday in February, Mother's day in March and Annual day in April.

K.G. parents are requested to attend special days like colours day in July, fruits day in September, vegetables day in November, Alphabets day in January and Numbers day in March.

29. ADMISSION PROCEDURE:

The admission in all the classes is on merit and first come first served basis. Students will be considered for admission to school only after their registration procedure.

Upon registration Prospectus and admission form may be obtained from the school office on payment of the prescribed amount.

(Which is neither refundable nor transferable. Registration fees is not refundable either)

30. ENCLOSURES :

The following enclosures should compulsorily to be attached with the application form:

- a) Birth certificate
- b) Transfer certificate from the school attended previously
- c) 8 latest passport coloured photographs

31. AGE FOR ADMISSION:

Pupil seeking admission in Pre-Kg should be in the age group of 2 years 6 months as on 1st June of the Academic year. Pre. K.G toddlers are requested to bring an additional set of dress and a piece of towel on the school opening day in case the uniform gets soiled.

Diaper care on requirement would be provided and deducted from the caution deposit.



A student is enrolled in the school for at least one academic year. In case of withdrawal, the parent/guardian is advised to intimate the decision of withdrawal of his/her ward to the school in writing one month in advance.

In the absence of prior notice the scholars will have to pay a month's fee & other relevant fees.

Transfer certificate will be issued after clearing all dues and accounts on payment of Rs. 500/ as fee for transfer certificate (Rs. 100/- for a duplicate)

33. REMOVAL FROM THE SCHOOL:

A student can be expelled from the school if he/she is found to be a bad conduct, disciplinary action and repeated detention in the same class.

34. SCHOOL FEES I EKNATIONAL SCHOOL

Fee will be accepted in cash which should be paid monthly for 11 months from June to April.

The school fees have to be paid before the 5th of each month. Late fees would be imposed with a fine of Rs. 10/- per day for every consecutive days after the last date of the 5th of every month.

All fee receipts should be produced for verification demanded.

Except for caution money, fee once paid will not be refundable. Caution money will be deemed to have been forfeited if not claimed within six months.

The scholars will have to pay 11 months conveyance fee apart from tuition fee. There will be no relaxation in conveyance fee if student is absent from school for a month or so. Annual day fees (Rs 500) would be collected after the summative Assessment II.

The conveyance fee will be charged for the full month even if the conveyance facility is availed by a scholar for part of the month.

35. SCHOOL UNIFORMS:

School uniform is compulsory for all classes which can be solely purchased from the school authorities only and can be stitched anywhere.

As per proposal in parent teachers meeting the uniform will be changed according to the seasonable variation.

Uniform pattern will be given at the beginning of the seasons. Shoes should be provided by the parent, upon the request of the parents it can be provided on payment.

38. GUIDELINES FOR THE PARENTS/GUARDIANS:

- If the parents have any grievance/suggestions to offer, they are welcome to write to the Principal or to meet her in person from 2 – 3 Pm.
- Third Saturdays are open for parents to meet the respective class teachers from morning 10am to 1pm.
- Since parents and teachers have a common goal of bringing the children into all round development of personality skills, physical, mental and moral, we appeal to the parents for their full co-operation in all matters concerning the education of their children.
- Please see your child's diary everyday and help follow the Principal's and teacher's remarks and messages, and sign as a proof of it.
- Please send your child to school only if he/she is physically fit and is in a position to continue to till the classes are
 over
- If a child is absent from school due to any reason, please mark in the dairy in the respective column of ABSENT NOTES.
- Please co-operate with the school authorities and staff in enforcing school rules and discipline, observing that your
 child studies regularly at home, comes to school regularly and timely, maintains a continuity in his/her school work
 and effectively takes helpful interest in the school activity.
- Parents are advised to see that good habits pertaining to studies, morality, food and health which are taught in the school are continued when children are at home.
- Student's regularity and punctuality are to be maintained. No leave is accepted without absent notes. It is mandatory for the parents to inform about leave/absence of their ward well in advance to the school.
- The ward brings necessary meals and drinks with him in an easy opening lunch box.
- The ward is not allowed to bring with his/her any weapons to the school including Blades, Knives, etc.
- See that your ward has all text books, items of stationery, craft materials etc. right in the beginning of the session.
- . Ensure that all the books and notebooks are covered with the brown paper.
- Ensure that your ward comes to the school in the proper uniform with polished shoes trimmed hair and clean nails.
- Intimate to the school in case of change in address, telephone number.
- Do not walk into the class room or meet the teacher in the classroom. Meet the teacher only with a prior appointment through the Principal.
- Students must be directed by their parents to maintain cordial relation with their classmates and pay respect to Teacher, Non-teaching staff and senior students.

39. GENERAL REGULATIONS:

All students should converse only in English inside the school premises, to develop their fluency in the English language.

- Students/parents/guardians will be bound by the rules and regulations in all respects which may be modified from time to time and all matters of dispute are subjected to the final decision of the Principal/Managing director.
- Students should be decent, courteous and polite at all times whether they are in the class or in the school premises.
- Students should be orderly and disciplined at the time of assembling for prayer, assembly and also at other functions.
- Students should respect the beauty and cleanliness of the school and take utmost care to promote the same.

40. INSTRUCTIONS TO THE STUDENTS

- Students must be punctual for the class. Those who come late or those who have been absent on the previous day, must submit the late attendance or absence record signed by their parents to the class teacher.
- Pupils are responsible for the care of their personal belongings. Expensive jewels or ornaments are strongly discouraged and the school management takes no responsibility for their loss.
- Students should always be clean and well dressed in complete uniform as mentioned earlier. Shirts should be tucked in. Hair and nails should be groomed regularly.
- Changing of classrooms between periods should be done in silence.
- 5. Every pupil must possess the school diary which should be brought to school daily with the signature of the parent.
- The bell before a class or assembly is a call to be obeyed promptly.
- 7. The pupils should not be absent from any test and examinations. No retest will be given in such cases.
- Students should not leave the school premises during school hours without the permission of the Principal.
- Parents or relatives are not allowed to meet the children or the teachers during school hours. If necessary they are allowed to do so with the permission of the Principal.
- 10. Any damage to the school building or property of the school by a student will have to be replaced by him.
- 11. Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, neglect of homework, disobedience, disrespect towards teacher, malpractices in the exam hall and other irresponsible behaviors will lead to the expulsion of the student.
- 12. All students must be present on the re-opening day of the school after any vacation.
- 13. Those who want to discontinue their studies in the middle or in any month of the academic year should pay their fees in full for the whole year. Then only the transfer certificate will be issued.
- 14. The students are continually assessed throughout the year in various aspects like homework, attendance, classroom behavior and regular exam and promotion to next class is given based above. The final exam assures the effort of students.
- 15. As the medium of instruction is English, students are advised strictly to converse in English only at the school campus.
- 16. Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited inside the school campus.
- 17. Students are expected to be active and interactive during the class hours, based on this grade effort column will be given by the concerned teacher.
- 18. Discipline Cards: Green cards are issued to well behavior students. Yellow cards are given for tardiness in arrival, attendance and submission for work. Red cards are given for indiscipline in school, class or bus, three red cards will result in severe disciplinary action.
- 19. Removal from School Rolls: Students' behavior which is not subject to school discipline and obedience will result in removal of students from school rolls after three warnings. An unhealthy continuous critical attitude of the parents towards the school would also result in removal of child's name from school rolls as that would generate a negative attitude in the students' behavior towards the teachers and the school management.
